Kevin Mullin, Estes Park Health

- In the process of putting together 2021 Paint Estes Pink, awareness and fundraising campaign for cancer services here in EP. Usually diagnostic or treatment funding. Partnership is with Rooftop Rodeo, which will happen first week of July.
- Collaboration opportunity: we are raising money to assist EP Health with a new MRI system. This is an important system that provides imaging to patients who need internal organs or the spine scanned for problems. First one was purchased in 2013, a used system. Now at the point that it needs to be replaced. Cost to replace is \$1.1M. Prior to 2013, an MRI truck would come to Estes twice a week. EPH is committed to continuing to provide this service in EP.
- EP Health is hiring house-keepers, FT with benefits year-round.
- New Director of Laboratory Services started yesterday. Take our lab department to the next level.
- Although the mask guidance has changed in Larimer County, we do still require health check inside Estes Park Health facility. This is a CDC recommendation we continue to follow.

- <u>Library is hiring</u> a Youth Services Librarian and an Adult Services & Civic Engagement Librarian.
- Volunteer opps: Cliffhanger Used Books (operated by Library Friends and Foundation). Now open 7 days a week 10-6pm.
- As we open second floor, we open the Makerspace. If you can imagine it, we can help you make it. Did you know we can etch on wine glasses or water bottles? Looking for Makerspace Guides, all training provided to someone who can help people come in to make and troubleshoot. All equipment available.

Denise Lord, Restorative Justice

- If anyone knows someone interested in caring for a one-year old, I need help. I am currently working from a friends' home in Longmont virtually cause that is the closes childcare I can find.

Sue Yowell, Estes Park Learning Place

- We just had our annual fundraiser over Zoom. It was a partnership with Mama Roses and Poppys and Rock Cut Brewery. Nick Mollé and Sean Doherty filmed the brewing process for beer. The Beer named after Les Deux Oreilles ("Two Ears" which is named for Longs and Meeker). We asked participants why the Learning Place was important to them. This was great way to gather testimonials. It also helped inform people who were new to the Learning Place.
- Schools out, which always brings turnover in students, some looking to keep up and catch up. Governor just put through a new grant to help students that have lost ground this last year. Hopeful we can do some new things with EP schools to execute that.
- Losing two tutors and hiring two new ones.
- Majority of students are on financial assistance. Regular rates are \$48 for the first hour, half that for subsequent hours. United Way grant with partnership with schools often underwrites the fees.
- Looking for new board members. Currently at 6, wanting to get back to 9.
- Grant from Thrift Shop will support Family Café. We reached a milestone of 100+ GED exams last week!

Naomi Hawf, Housing Authority

- Staff has been short-handed for a while, and I am pleased to say we are onboarding 2 new staff persons. We total 7 staff members, myself, a housing supervisor, 3 property mgrs and 2 maintenance staff. We have been busy with the following:
- 1. supporting the needs of renters via rental assistance
- 2. involvement with the Town on Fish Hatchery Housing Plans and ensuring compliance in the workforce housing apartments and homes
- 3. helping to share the housing options that the new Wildfire home ownership development will bring
- 4. partnering with Habitat and a local church to bring another affordable home ownership option to the community
- 5. filling our Peak View apartments

Morgan Riedesel, COSLAW

• Naloxone Training for Opioid Overdose is Tuesday, June 22, 5 - 6pm. At Crossroads. Training will cover what Naloxene is, harm reduction, especially with tourist season, could be important to know that. <u>mriedesel.alliance@nocoha.org</u>

Jose Almeida, Estes Park Schools

- School is out. Graves apartments a couple weeks ago. Town is trying to build safe sidewalks on the way to school. Was approached to do translations. When I was translating results, found out that no Latinos had participated. On both sides of Graves, lots of Latinos are living, likely more than 300 people. Important to include Latinos, they are the ones most affected by new sidewalk. First time in Estes Park, held an event and provided food and ice cream and went from 0-60 people providing input. Latinos are important and part of this town. Engineers and Town Administrators were the ones providing the food, important that public servants are engaging with the public.
- Talked to Library about how to reach Latino community: systematically provide more English to the parents. The loneliest people are the Latino kids, their parents can't help them with homework or are uncomfortable participating in English based activities. In order to feel they belong, something systemic must happen. Anything else is just patches. Latino kids loose pride, they think Spanish, their culture, their family is not important. By the time they go to HS, they can not communicate with parents. Volunteers need to become **paid** teachers. Inclusivity is something we must actively pursue.
- Rotary Club reached out to create Latino/Spanish library. How do we convey the message that these people are important? 70%+ of the workers in Estes

Park are Latino, many work 2 jobs. They need help, and if they leave, they will severely affect the employment situation in Estes.

[LDM notes the community has two collaborative grants out to United Way about racial equity. One is led by the Town of Estes Park, the other is a nonprofit grant with the Economic Development Corporation. The industry that has the most Latinx community are the business community. If we are successful in our funding, the EDC will create a Latinx cohort to elevate existing business owners and support entrepreneurship in the at community. Nonprofit community can access that as network and support system, show and give importance to volunteers, on our boards, etc.]
